Background

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, with the approval of its Consulting Engineer, instituted a self-insured worker's compensation program effective May 1, 1988. Paragraph 715.4(1) of the Amended and Restated Trust Indenture of The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, dated March 31, 1999, requires that "each such self-insurance program shall include an actuarially sound reserve fund, if any, as recommended by the Consulting Engineers, out of which claims are to be paid and the adequacy of such funds shall be evaluated not later than 90 days after the end of each insurance year.

The Tollway has established a locally-held depository account known as the Workers Compensation Claim Reserve Fund for its workers compensation self insurance program, the balance of which is net of all workers compensation claims paid through such date.
